


Pastor's Message

On a recent Sunday morning several acts of love occurred during worship. All of these actions took place quietly, unobtrusively, yet each one put into practice Jesus' command that we love one another.

An elderly member was dropped off at the church without a walker or cane. One member searched the basement to find a walker. While the search was being conducted, a second church member offered to escort the elderly member to a seat in the sanctuary and sit with the person through worship. Two unselfish acts of hospitality that easily could have gone unnoticed. Nothing was done for show or attention, these were acts of service rendered in love to one in need. Partway through the service, a church member developed a coughing fit. The worshiper sitting in the pew behind offered assistance guiding the coughing member into the narthex. After some discussion with those staffing the Audio/ Visual booth, the coughing member was taken to the nursery where a closed circuit broadcast of worship could be watched. The member was provided a cup of water to help with the coughing and was able to participate in worship from the nursery. Here too, simple, unselfish acts demonstrated love and concern for another.

While each one of these acts were done

independently, taken together there was a distinct sense of love for each other that morning. It is this type of love and concern when shared both within and with those beyond

the congregations' membership that will attract people to Peace. These acts of kindness are prime examples of the "mutual affection among the believers" that is one of the marks of Jesus' Church. Following in Christ's footsteps means living a life of service; a life oriented outward toward the needs of another. It means occasionally having to be inconvenienced. Yet when service is performed in love it does not feel as an intrusion or a bother. It is a natural response that flows from God's love through us to another. What a joy it was to observe God's love in action!

The council has approved a service call to contact First Choice Irrigation to determine if the valves are in working order or need to be repaired.
