


Pastor's Message

Have you noticed that when the person sitting near the center isle of the Sanctuary only puts their name on the Friendship Pad, others follow suit? One way to assist the Church Office in obtaining contact information for a visitor is for members to complete the entire sign-in row in the Friendship Pad.

The Friendship Pad is an important tool for obtaining contact information for a visitor. Even though we have a Guest Book in the Narthex, most visitors who sign the Guest Book only sign their name. Knowing a person's name does not help in obtaining contact information. With many people having cell phones and no longer having land line telephones, the ability to search for a person's phone number using the White Pages becomes very difficult. (Cell phone numbers are not published in the White Pages.)

If you notice a person you are unfamiliar with sitting next to you or at the other end of the pew, try writing out your name, address, phone number and then checking the appropriate box (member, will take Lord's Supper, etc.) By setting the example of completing

the entire row, there is a much better chance that others sitting next to you will do so as well. A visitor unfamiliar with a congregation's practices will imitate what people around them are doing. If I'm a visitor and I only see people's names on the pad,



Once the Friendship Pad is passed back to the center aisle, you have a wonderful tool to find out the name of the stranger sitting in the same pew with you. Open the cover and read the name! Then make it a point to introduce yourself to the person while waiting for your pew to be dismissed after the final hymn. There is ample time to say "Hello!" and "Welcome" or "Would you please join us for fellowship" before the usher grants permission to leave your seat!


The annual chili cook off will take place on Sunday, March 4 following the service.

Week 4 - One metal nail clipper (large or small), remove packaging.


Week 5 - One light-weight bath-size towel, a dark color is recommended (20" x 40" or 52" x 27" accepted)

What Does This Mean to Me?

This regular newsletter feature—playing on Luther's famous line in the Small Catechism—is designed to help us all better understand why things happen as they do at Peace. The worship committee actively seeks feedback or questions from congregation members confused or concerned about worship practices. Often when one person raises a question, others have similar thoughts but do not want to ask the question.

What is Lutheran Worship?

Lutheran worship transcends culture in that it is not about us, how we feel, or what we get out of it. Lutheran worship publicly proclaims that we are dead by God's judgement and through God's grace and mercy we are raised on account of Christ's forgiveness.

This is seen in the order of worship with a Confession of Sins (we are dead by God's judgement of our sin), Proclamation (reading of the Word, preaching of a sermon), and Celebration of Holy Communion (sharing in Christ's meal for the forgiveness of sins). Renewed by grace, we are sent out to serve. The emphasis is always on what God is doing – forgiving us,



gathering us back to him, feeding us, and sending us.

Worship proclaims that God continues to be at work in the world, edifying His holy people through the gifts of His presence through the proclaimed word and sacraments.

Martin Luther said it best when dedicating a new mission congregation, "Nothing else [need ever happen] except that our dear Lord himself may speak to us through his holy Word and we respond to him through prayer and praise."
